




UNAIDS coordinates and monitors the UN response to HIV AND the Global AIDS Response




Increase of Global AIDS Resources (US\$B)



Unprecedented, Rapid Scale-up of HIV Treatment





Progress to stop infants born with HIV by 2015 and keep their mothers alive (MDGs 4,5,6)




What This Means for UN Results?

We Have Achieved MDG6(A): Halted and Begun to Reverse Spread of HIV/AIDS by 2015




Getting to Zero: Number of AIDS deaths

Different scenarios from 2011 to 2050



Monitoring and Advocating for Greater Domestic Investment in AIDS




81 countries increased domestic investments for AIDS by more than 50% between 2006 and 2011


Human cost of delaying prevention:
