VMGs may include, but are not limited to: children (adolescent girls in particular), pregnant women, indigenous people, ethnic minorities, internally displaced persons, migrant workers, sex workers, persons living with HIV, persons with disabilities, and elderly persons.	One of the commitments made at the World Humanitarian Summit speaks of managing crisis risks and reducing vulnerability as much as a "humanitarian imperative" to save lives, as a "development necessity" to ensure progress towards the SDGs, and that no one is left behind. The need to transcend the humanitarian-development divide is not new and the conversation is now increasingly framed in terms of a nexus between the two. This EPE session will delve into the question of what do evaluations say (and not say) about the Humanitarian-Development Nexus.
